The Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA) e-learning course is mandatory for all UN Funds and Programmes Personnel including volunteers and contractors, whether at Headquarters or at other duty stations. This e-learning course is composed of a set of lessons designed to raise your awareness about Sexual Exploitation and Abuse, become familiar with a range of measures to combat Sexual Exploitation and Abuse, understand what the impact of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse on victims is and the consequences for UN Personnel who commit Sexual Exploitation and Abuse.

Through discussion, examples and case studies, the course will familiarize you with the UN Standards of Conduct on Sexual Exploitation and Abuse and your obligations to uphold these standards, what you can do to prevent Sexual Exploitation and Abuse and how to report such abuses by UN Personnel. If you are a manager (Head of Office / Head of Department), you will learn about additional responsibilities to enforce the UN standards of conduct.

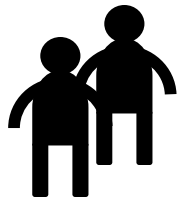
Thematic learning dashboards [topic, regional scope or large initiative driven]



Curated by channel managers and/or using feeds from the catalogue and other sources



Subscription-based and on-going. They encourage continuing development practices.



Integrated to Yammer based groups and Communities of Practice.

Learning channels: elements...

- Guest access + “subscribe” block
- Blocks, blocks, blocks...
- Format type linked to a theme (allowing block on the central part of the page)
- Easy listing of learning activities with “manual activities” (handpicked selection of courses) or “highlighted activities” (automated display based on rules / filters).

- Mandatory courses are pushed at the audience level (additional tab)
- “Equivalent courses” feature (to define language versions and/or other courses for which completion is also accepted)
- Consideration of language preferences and current enrolments / completions

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
